Admissions Criteria

- Application for admission (new graduates must complete licensure prior to application)
- Associate degree (ADN) or diploma in nursing from a regionally accredited institution
- A current, unencumbered license as a Registered Nurse from the state in which the student resides***
- Professional liability insurance
- Valid American Heart Association CPR certification
- Meet RN to BSN program immunization requirements
- Minimum GPA of 2.0 and must have a "C" or better in all transfer credits
- "C" or better in all required nursing prerequisites
- Must pass a criminal background check

*NUR major courses start in January, May and August. Students can also begin with general education and/or elective requirements in March, June and October

**This does not include required general education courses, as this may differ per student based on what they are able to transfer in to the program.

***Must reside in a SARA (State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement) approved state. See website for details.

**ADN transfer students can transfer in a max of 65 hours and will need approximately 18 hours of general education credits with NC Wesleyan College. The total hours needed and specific coursework will depend on individual transcript analysis.

***NUR-410 is a 16-week, 6 credit course that is taken over the course of both summer sessions A & B.
