ADMISSIONS CRITERIA:

- An undergraduate degree in subject or related field
- Resume with two references (must be able to provide reference letters upon request)*
- Complete a statement of purpose
- Minimum undergraduate GPA of 2.5

**MSCJ students require two years of experience in criminal justice or related field. Students not meeting this criteria will be required to complete an internship once admitted to the program.*

Note: Graduate school applicants with a cumulative GPA below 2.5 may still be considered based upon other factors submitted in the application.
